AMERICAN-BELGIAN PRIVATE INTERNATIONAL LAW. By *Georges van Hecke*. Dobbs Ferry, N.Y.: Oceana Publications, Inc., 1968. Pp. 127. \$7.50. An examination of the legal relations existing between Belgium and the United States, and the effect on private citizens.

AMERICAN CONFLICTS OF LAW. By *Robert A. Leflar*. Indianapolis: Bobbs-Merrill Company, Inc., 1968. Pp. lxxvi, 677. \$19.50. This book, a revision of *The Law of Conflict of Laws*, represents a new analysis in the areas of conflicts law which have undergone vast changes in the past decade—choice-of law, long-arm statutes, federal-state relations, full-faith and credit.

ANTI-FEDERALISTS VERSUS FEDERALISTS. Edited by *John D. Lewis*. San Francisco: Chandler Publishing Co., 1967. Pp. xi, 423. \$——. A presentation of the arguments which were used in support of and in an attempt to defeat the passage of the United States Constitution.

BASIC LAWS AND AUTHORITIES ON HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT. By Committee on Banking and Currency, House of Representatives. Washington: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1968. Pp. ix, 796. \$——. A revision of the May 15, 1967 printing of the same name, with the addition of relevant laws enacted and executive orders issued in 1967.

CATHOLIC INSTITUTIONS IN THE UNITED STATES. By *John J. McGrath*. Washington: The Catholic University of America Press, 1968. Pp. ix, 48. \$1.75. A study of the legal status of institutions conducted by the Catholic Church.

CONCERNING DISSENT AND CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE. By *Abe Fortas*. New York: The New American Library, Inc., 1968. Pp. x, 128. \$1.00. An Associate Justice of the Supreme Court makes a frank statement about dissent from a philosophical point of view, and explains why, if he had been a Negro living in Little Rock, he would have disobeyed state segregation laws.

THE CRIME OF PUNISHMENT. By *Karl Menninger, M.D.* New York: The Viking Press, 1968. Pp. xii, 305. \$8.95. A look at the insufficiencies

and follies of criminal punishment, and a presentation of the hope that lies in psychiatry.

CRIMINAL LAW AND THE CONSTITUTION: SOURCES AND COMMENTARIES. Edited by *John W. Reed, Virginia Davis Nordin, Albert G. Sugarman, and James E. Rice.* Ann Arbor: The Institute of Continuing Legal Education, 1968. Pp. 398. \$10.00. A thorough examination of the constitutional status of the criminal law in lieu of the momentous recent decisions of the Supreme Court.

A CRITICAL STUDY OF AMERICAN INTERVENTION IN VIETNAM. By *Charles Chaumont.* Belgium: J. Van Keerberghen & Sons, 1968. Pp. 86. \$0.80. A critical examination of the struggle in Vietnam.

CURRENT LEGAL CONCEPTS IN EDUCATION. Edited by *Lee O. Garber.* Philadelphia: University of Pennsylvania Press, 1968. Pp. 325. \$7.50. A series of lectures discussing the increasing involvement of government and law in the school affairs of local communities.

THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE. By *Luther A. Huston.* New York: Frederick A. Praeger, Publishers, 1967. Pp. xi, 270. \$5.95. A newsman discusses the U.S. Department of Justice, its history, its purposes, and its personnel.

THE END OF OBSCENITY: THE TRIALS OF LADY CHATTERLY, TROPIC OF CANCER AND FANNY HILL. By *Charles Rembar.* New York: Random House, 1968. Pp. xii, 528. \$8.92. A lawyer uses lay language to report on three important obscenity trials and the battle to have the courts recognize a book's literary quality in the test for obscenity.

FOREIGN POLICY AND INTERNATIONAL LAW. By *Charles G. Fenwick.* Dobbs Ferry, N.Y.: Oceana Publications, Inc. 1968. Pp. xii, 142. \$6.00. A discussion of the history, traditions, and circumstances which formed the issues of foreign policy in recent international history.

HOW COURTS DECIDE. By *Albert T. Franz.* Buffalo: William S. Hein & Co., Inc., 1968. Pp. 111. \$7.50. A former state supreme court justice attempts to eliminate the communication gap which makes the high courts "the least understood segment of . . . the three branches of government."
