- ADMIRALTY AND FEDERALISM. By *D. W. Robertson*. Mineola, N. Y.: Foundation Press, 1970. Pp. x, 327. \$9.50. A history and analysis of problems of federal-state relations in the maritime law of the United States.
- CARDOZO AND FRONTIERS OF LEGAL THINKING. Rev. Ed. By *B. H. Levy*. Cleveland: Case Western Reserve University Press, 1969. Pp. xi, 365. \$9.95. A study exploring the process of the continuous recreation of legal doctrine by the judiciary, with Justice Cardozo as its focal point. It deals with Cardozo's philosophic approach to law, his relationship to the jurisprudence of his day, and his methods and practices as a judge.
- CENSORSHIP LANDMARKS. By *E. de Grazia*. New York: R. R. Bowker Co., 1969. Pp. xxxii, 657. \$19.75. An accumulation of the important decisions since 1900 dealing with censorship of movies, publications, and other related material.
- THE CHURCHES: THEIR RICHES, REVENUES, AND IMMUNITIES. By *M. A. Larson* and *C. S. Lowell*. Washington: Robert B. Luce, Inc., 1969. Pp. xii, 301. \$5.00. A definitive work on the current status of religious tax exemption.
- CIVIL RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THE CONSTITUTION. By *S. H. Asch*. New York: Arco, 1968. Pp. 218. \$4.95. An exposition of the provisions of the Constitution relating to the nature and background of our constitutional rights and responsibilities. The author explains how the Supreme Court has evolved so as to shape both the substance and procedure in the field of constitutional law to meet the demands of a changing American society. He also discusses the genesis of many civil rights concepts and how they have met some of the most disturbing ethical and legal issues of our day.
- COMMON LAW PLEADING. By *J. H. Koffler* and *A. Reppy*. St. Paul: West, 1969. Pp. xxiv, 663. \$——. A comprehensive work on the historical background, development, and modern practice of common law pleading, supported by an extensive citation of English and American cases.

CONGRESS V. THE SUPREME COURT. By *R. Berger*. Cambridge: Harvard Press, 1969. Pp. xii, 424. \$15.00. An analysis of the scope of power of the United States Supreme Court and the extent to which it has exercised or usurped those powers as envisaged by Congress.

THE DARTMOUTH COLLEGE CASE AND THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE PENUMBRA. By *H. J. Friendly*. Austin, Texas: University of Texas, 1969. Pp. 41. \$4.00. A lecture honoring the sesquicentennial of Webster's famous argument before the Supreme Court in the Dartmouth College case. The subject covers the extent to which the guarantees of the Fourteenth Amendment apply to private institutions.

THE DOCTRINE OF CONSIDERATION. By *E. Jenks*. Holmes Beach, Fla.: W. W. Grant & Sons, 1969. Pp. 225. \$16.50. An historical study of the doctrine of consideration, covering its early history, the period of abridgement, and the present-day concept.

DOUBLE JEOPARDY: THE DEVELOPMENT OF A LEGAL AND SOCIAL POLICY. By *J. A. Sigler*. Ithaca, N. Y.: Cornell University Press, 1969. Pp. x, 264. \$9.75. The history and development of double jeopardy as a legal and social policy, as well as its present application in the fifty-one jurisdictions in the United States.

ENGLISH AND AMERICAN JUDGES AS LAWMAKERS. By *L. L. Jaffe*. Oxford: Clarendon Press, 1969. Pp. x, 113. \$3.50. An exploration of judicial lawmaking, motivated by the recent bold innovations of the United States Supreme Court.

FREEDOM OF CHOICE. By *Y. R. Simon*. New York: Fordham Press, 1969. Pp. xvii, 167. \$5.50. An investigation into the problem of free choice and human freedom of the will

A GUIDE TO UNINSURED MOTORIST COVERAGE. By *A. I. Widiss*. Cincinnati: W. H. Anderson, 1969. Pp. xv, 433. \$25.00. A comprehensive collection of material and information to facilitate the handling of accident claims under uninsured motorist coverage.

HISTORICAL FOUNDATION OF THE COMMON LAW. By *S. F. C. Nelson*. London: Butterworth, 1969. Pp. xiv, 466. \$10.50. The purpose of the book is to give a simple picture of the development of the common law and to draw main outlines of the subject.

A study providing data about the information physicians furnish patients prior to surgery and how some physicians are able to function within a structured disclosed process. It provides data about the results of this structured process in terms of the amount of time that need be devoted by the surgeon to disclosure and to other matters in the process.

LAW OF MASS COMMUNICATIONS: FREEDOM AND CONTROL OF PRINT AND BROADCAST MEDIA. By *H. L. Nelson* and *D. L. Teeter, Jr.* Mineola, N. Y.: Foundation Press, 1969. Pp. xv, 588. \$10.50. An analysis of the legal control of the press, focusing on the areas of constitutional protections for persons involved in defamation, privacy, obscenity, copyright law, right of free press, and others.

MISTAKE AND MISREPRESENTATIONS: A STUDY IN CONTRACTUAL PRINCIPLES. By *S. J. Stoljor.* London: Sweet & Maxwell, 1968. Pp. xvi, 159. \$7.50. A study of the large body of complex ideas that form our contractual law of mistake and misrepresentation. The book includes an analysis of English, American, and Australian case law.

PENNSYLVANIA DAMAGES: PERSONAL INJURY VERDICTS. By *G. A. Troutman.* Philadelphia: George T. Bisel Co., 1969. Pp. 320. \$22.50. A compilation of personal injury verdicts, with concentration on the cases of the 1960's in order to demonstrate the inflationing trend.

PENNSYLVANIA ESTATE PLANNING AND DRAFTING. 2 vols. By *J. B. Aker.* Philadelphia: George T. Bisel Co., 1969. \$60.00. A compilation of the general principles of estate planning, with emphasis on inter vivos trusts, business interests, charitable gifts, powers of attorney, and general testamentary trusts.

PROSECUTION: THE DECISION TO CHARGE A SUSPECT WITH A CRIME. By *F. W. Miller.* Boston: Little, Brown & Co., 1969. Pp. xviii, 366. \$12.50. The report of the American Bar Foundation's survey of the administration of criminal justice in the United States.

THE PROTECTION OF LITERARY PROPERTY. By *P. Wittenberg.* Boston: The Writer, Inc., 1968. Pp. ix, 267. \$7.95. A treatment of the copyright law and its application to authors, publishers and editors in the light of modern advances by the publishing industry.

PUBLIC EMPLOYEE LABOR LAW. By *D. P. Sullivan*. Cincinnati: W. H. Anderson, 1969. Pp. xiii, 312. \$35.00. A project designed to touch upon many points of the public employer-public employee labor relationship.

SENTENCING: THE DECISION AS TO TYPE, LENGTH, AND CONDITIONS OF SENTENCE. By *R. O. Dawson*. Boston: Little, Brown & Co., 1969. Pp. xxxii, 428. \$12.50. An exploration of the initial imposition of sentence by the trial judge and subsequent correctional decisions, such as the decisions to revoke probation, to grant parole, and to revoke parole.

SUPREME COURT PRACTICE. 4th Ed. Edited by *R. L. Stern* and *E. Gressman*. Washington: BNA, 1969. Pp. xxxv, 691. \$17.50. An exposition of the principles of jurisdiction which determine whether a case can and should be taken to the Supreme Court, and as to the kinds of petitions for certiorari, Jurisdictional Statements, briefs, and oral arguments which are thought to be favored by the Court.
