**THE LAWYER, THE PUBLIC, AND PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY.** By *F. Raymond Marks*, with *Kirk Leswing* and *Barbara A. Fortinsky*. Chicago: American Bar Foundation, 1972. Pp. xii, 305. \$7.95. The authors present a critical analysis of the "public interest" movement currently being revitalized within the legal profession. This book examines how and why the legal profession failed in the past and continues to fail to discharge its responsibilities to the public.

**DRUGS AND THE PUBLIC.** By *Norman E. Zinberg* and *John A. Robertson*. New York: Simon and Schuster, 1972. Pp. 288. \$8.95. A sociological study of today's American drug culture and its legal ramifications. The authors present and evaluate the most recent research data on drug use from public attitudes to actual drug related harm.

**JUSTICE DENIED.** By *Leonard Downie, Jr.* Baltimore: Penguin Books, Inc., 1972. Pp. 224. \$1.45. An attack on the defects of the American court system. The author unveils the shortcomings of the court system, including overflowing dockets, the poor man's dilemma, prejudices of the bench, and bail/bond robbery.
